Apologies for the lateness of this report – the editor (Di) was waiting on my report and I kept on forgetting to complete it.

Well welcome to 2021. I reflect back on previous reports and last year I made comment on how time goes quick and it looks like 2021 is not going to be any different. I know for myself I am going to try and enjoy every opportunity that comes my way this year.

We have started the year with a bang in Dinham, with some very obvious changes happening.

As you can see the front of Dinham in having a major upgrade. The pavers and lawn that we had were really a trip hazard, and we have had a few residents that have fallen over. We are relaying the old pavers and replacing the lawn with artificial lawn.

This will mean that we can use the lawn for more activities, such as lawn bowls.

We hope that this project will be completed by the end of March.

What do you all think if we put a small playground area at the end of the Garden? - We are having a lot of children visit now and it would be great for them to have an area to play in - I would love to hear your thoughts.

The Activities garden has also started - we again are going to reuse the pavers but we are leveling the ground and then we are getting sliding doors so we can have an outdoor/ indoor area, this will start when the front garden is finished.

The Aged Care office has had a facelift and the Diversional Therapy office will be relocating into the Dinham lounge (in the nook area of the room).

We are purchasing new furniture for the Dinham lounge and new outdoor furniture.

We are also making the kitchen area in your dining room bigger; we are taking out the glass and turning the office into a pantry and having a bigger serving area.

Also, a large shed (fully funded by a donation from Mr Murrie), has been purchased and will house the bus, postman pat and a new workshop for maintenance. It will be where the shipping container is currently living – the plans are currently with council.

So a lot is happening.

We have had a few changes in management and I would like to welcome Monique Rooney to Dinham, who will be working with you as the new Aged Care Nurse. Monique has been working with us as a Registered Nurse since November, she will be working specifically in Dinham every Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.

We are now updating your family via text message if there has been any changes in your care, if the Doctor has seen you and any updates that are happening in Dinham and the Hospital. If you have a mobile phone and you would also like to get a message please contact Admin staff at the hospital.

Late last year we said good bye to 3 residents - 2 lovely ladies – Heather Darby and Maxine Hawke and 1 gentlemen Glenmore Spurling We welcome to our family – Dennis Dalby, Rikki Watson and David Murrie, please make them feel welcome.

Monday the 8th is the Hospital AGM - it will be held at the Health Centre at 7pm and you are welcome to attend.

The hospital accreditation has been put on hold again due to COVID – the auditors are from Queensland and NSW, so they are unable to travel due to their own internal regulations.

Dinham accreditation will be October this year - I will be making time to discuss what accreditation means and what your role is throughout the year.

COVID is still very much a part of our lives and I think it will be with us forever. I am yet to find out the direction of the COVID immunization, but we will give you lots of information about this when it becomes available.

We are no longer taking temperatures on any one that enters the facility - but we are taking your temperature weekly.

However, if you do have any flu like symptoms please tell us immediately.

Every time there is an outbreak in Australia, we receive a direction on what we should do, currently Western Australia & Victoria borders are closed.

In the front foyer there is a lot of information on COVID if you would like to read anything that you need to know, and as always if you have any questions please ask staff for assistance.

Have a great year everyone, I am looking forward to seeing what the year will bring.

Reminders:

Valuables: It is a facility recommendation that all personal items are to be labelled. We encourage families to keep your loved one's valuable items at your home.

Electrical items: All electrical equipment that is brought into the facility needs to be tagged and tested. Please give the equipment to the staff, they will contact maintenance for this to be arranged. It is essential for safety reasons that any electrical items are checked before they are placed in the rooms.

Clothing Labelling: It is very important to ensure all items of clothing entering the facility are labelled correctly.

We have a clothing labelling machine. There is a cost relating to the labelling.

Please speak to staff.

Social Distancing: Just reminding all that everyone must respect the social distancing and Hand Hygiene rules. The residents are classed as a family so they can come within the 1.5 m distancing of each other.

Visiting Hours: 11.00am – 4.00pm. To visit the aged care section, you must have had a flu shot and our Admin office must have verification of this. There are only 2 visitors per visit allowed.

Activities room: Families can book this room for a family lunch, coffee or just a chat. Please speak to staff to book a table. COVID rules apply.

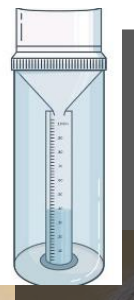

February has 28 or 29 days. The 29th day is every 4 years during a leap year. February is named for the Latin word februum which means purification

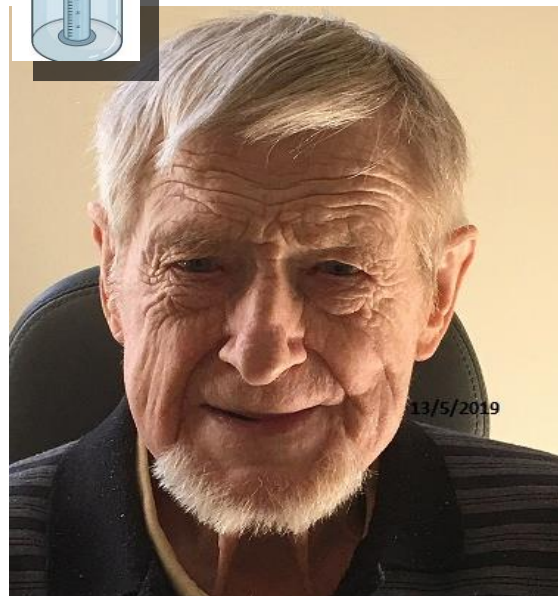
